Queen's stage of the Transalpine Run completed. Over 90% of all runners still in the race

After 46 kilometers and around 2600 meters of altitude, more than 500 runners of the Dynafit Transalpine Run powered by Garmin reached the finish line in See.

The Swiss "flatland fighters" Tobias Schmid and Ramon Gut didn't let anything get in their way this time after the close finishes on the first two days and won the queen stage after 5:33:58 hours with a lead of around 20 minutes over the Samnaun Racers and third-placed Team Südtirol Reschensee. "We're a bit surprised ourselves, especially as we were close together up to the highest point, but we'll just do our thing and see what comes out at the back," commented Tobias on the stage.

The lead in the women's race is even clearer: Lena Glasbrenner and Johanna Steinmüller from the "Allgäu Outlet Racing Team" confidently took their third stage win and are now more than half an hour ahead of the second-placed Austrians Nina Lang and Veronika Hamminger from the "Summitsox" team. The British mixed team "Sportsshoes X Nike" with Sebastian Batchelor and Natalina Neuenschwander were also well ahead of "The Donut Duo" from Argentina and "skyrunning.pandas X Samnaun".

There was no change in the solo category either: Lukas Mangger from South Tyrol was not deterred by the onset of rain and confidently won the queen stage from Imst to See after just over five hours. Second place went to Nino Janki from Switzerland ahead of Benedikt Nussbaum from Germany. Fastest woman: Julia Güthling in 6:45:09 hours ahead of Iryna Rautschuk from the Ukraine and Anna Meyer from Germany.

Over 90% of all the teams and solo runners who started are still in the race and will take on the 4th stage tomorrow: 41 kilometers and 2600 vertical meters from See to Ischgl are on the TAR program.
